Brief Bio

Prof. Yashiv is a macroeconomist, mostly interested in issues relating to the labor market. His research spans a number of themes, including search and matching in the labor market (which was the major topic of his work in recent years), the labor market and financial markets, immigration issues and exchange rate economics.

Prof. Yashiv is a research fellow at the Center for Economic Policy Research (CEPR), at the Center for Economic Performance (CEP) of the London School of Economics, at the Centre for Research and Analysis of Migration (CReAM) at University College, London and at IZA.

Over the past three years (2007-2010), Prof. Yashiv has been a consultant to the Bank of Israel on issues regarding Israeli Arabs in the labor market. This is a project involving both academic, empirical work and policy prescriptions. In addition, Prof. Yashiv is involved in other policy related activity: He was the head of the Macro-economic team at the 17th annual Caesarea conference (2009), and has been consulting the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Employment on various occasions. Prof. Yashiv is also the Chair of the steering committee of the Vacancies Survey of the Central Bureau of Statistics. Additionally, Prof. Yashiv has published numerous OpEd pieces in Haaretz and The Marker newspapers.
